Faye McBride Horsley, longtime resident of Provo, passed away at the Utah Valley Regional Medical Center on June 18, 1995 after a lingering illness.

She was born in Kansas City, Missouri on November 19, 1921. She lived her childhood years in Kansas and Eastern Colorado until during the "dust bowl" years when she moved with her mother and father to Murray, Utah for a few years.



They eventually moved to Fort Dodge and Dodge City, Kansas, and later to Colorado, where she became a student at the Colorado School For The Deaf and the Blind in Colorado Springs after losing her hearing. She completed her training there during the next four years before her marriage.

On September 18, 1940 she married A. Burt Horsley in the Salt Lake LDS Temple.

She was an active member of the LDS Church, serving in many positions, both ward and stake, including Cub Scout Den Mother, Primary President, Jr Sunday School Coordinator, Relief Society Presidency, and Secretary.

She also served for several years as a Pink Lady at the Utah Valley Regional Medical Center.

She was a proud mother of three sons and two daughters with 27 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

She is survived by her husband A. Burt Horsley, three sons: Dee Clements Horsley, Laverne, California; Raymon Burt Horsley II, Youngstown, Ohio; John Franklin Horsley, American Fork, Utah; two daughters; Christine Horsley Ivers, Provo, Utah; and Linda Horsley Cook, Atlanta, Georgia.
