

# Death Takes LeGrande Horsley, Prominent Church, Civic Leader

Clarence LeGrande Horsley, 50, prominent Brigham City LDS church and civic leader, died at 4 p. m., Wednesday, in the Dee hospital at Ogden after an illness of 24 hours.

He was born Feb. 2, 1910, in Brigham City, a son of Clarence Eugene and Sarah Harding Horsley. He married Doril White on July 31, 1936 in the Logan LDS temple.

He graduated from Box Elder High school in 1928 and filled a mission for the LDS church in

Germany from 1928 to 1931. He later graduated from Utah State University at Logan.

After his marriage, he and his wife made their home in Washaki where he was a school teacher. They later resided in Malad, Idaho where he was employed by the I. C. Penney company and also taught LDS seminary.

**THEY LATER** resided in Logan and Salt Lake City for two years and in Shelley, Idaho for one year where he also taught seminary.

He was principal of the Brigham City LDS seminary and owner and manager of Horsley's dry goods store here at the time of his death.

He was a member of the LDS Box Elder stake high council and had served as bishop of the Malad Third ward as well as the Brigham City Second ward. He had been an active scout and was district scout executive of the Bird Haven district at the time of his death.

**HE WAS** a member of the Box Elder Chamber of Commerce and vice president of the Brigham City Rotary club.

He was a former mayor of Brigham City.

He is survived by his wife and two sons and a daughter: Brent LeGrande Horsley, serving in Berlin on an LDS mission; Martha Claire Horsley and Bill W. Horsley, both of Brigham City; a brother, George Harding Horsley of Ogden.
